

From Wisdom and Truth to Effect

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*If the cause of an effect is based on wisdom and truth, then this leads to good works and paths.
The wisdom and truth of the Bible.*

Behind every effect lies a cause. Everyone knows the principle of "cause and effect." Behind every cause lies information, and it is the actual cause of the effect. This article substantiates and fundamentally discusses the origin of information through biblical quotations; among other things, it also explores where humans acquire information and thus knowledge, gaining new insights in science and research; namely, that God places the thoughts of people in their hearts¹. Research has shown that the heart and brain are closely and extensively connected through the autonomic nervous system and neurotransmitters. This is known as the brain-heart axis.

For in Him we live and move and have our being (Acts 17:28). He surrounds us on all sides, which emphasizes the omnipresence of God (Psalm 139:1-5).

No one should believe they have discovered something and are boasting about it, and are seeking honor, attention, advancement and career, even leading to a professorship or the Nobel Prize. It comes from God alone! You are worthy to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they have their being and were created. To him belongs Glory alone. For further Bible verses, see "*Bible verses*".

Hiking in nature and along the beaches of the seas inspires us to ask new questions regarding knowledge and to promote research.

According to Kneipp, water treading promotes blood circulation. Nature is also the best therapy for healing minor ailments, especially mental and emotional suffering.

Immersing oneself in nature (matter ~ energy) – in God's word, which is dynamic information and energy/ power – promotes well-being and health and, through reflection on Bible verses, offers a

partial experience of being in eternity.²²

If *wisdom* and *truth* are not shaped by the Bible, then things look bad for the world; then fake news endangers the coexistence of nations and dictators and autocrats gain the upper hand.

Immanuel Kant, the central philosopher of the German Enlightenment, whose work centers on the *Critique of Pure Reason*, demonstrated that pure reason (*thinking without experience*) is insufficient to prove metaphysical questions such as the existence of God or the immortality of the soul. He investigated what reason can accomplish *prior* to all experience. His goal: Reason should come to know itself, so as not to remain mired in "dogmatic groping." Reason is

Reason is not only responsible for knowledge, but also for the source of the moral law

(*categorical imperative*). A person is truly free when their will is determined *solely* by reason, not by impulses or inclinations.

These statements are not based on reason or *light*, but on ignorance and darkness. See Bible verses. 1-12

In contrast, the statements made by Blaise Pascal are to be given much greater weight. He said:

Jesus Christ is the center of all things and the reason

for all things, and whoever does not know him knows nothing of the world and nothing of himself.

Knowing God without knowing **our** misery is a sign of arrogance. Knowing our misery without knowing God is a sign of despair. Knowing Jesus Christ provides the middle ground, because in him we find both God and our life

He was to bear witness to the light. That was the eternal light that illuminates all people who are in come to this world.

⁵ James 1:17: Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the *Father of the light*, in which there is no change or alternation of light and darkness.

⁶ John 3:19-21: This is the *judgment*: the light has come into the world, and the People loved darkness more than light, for their *deeds were evil*. Whoever does evil, He hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his *deeds should be exposed*.

But whoever lives by the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen, *for they are are done in God*.

⁷ 2 Corinthians 4:4 and 6: to the unbelievers, whose *minds the god of this world has blinded*, that

They do not see the *bright light of the gospel of the glory of Christ*, which is the

Image of God.

⁸ Matthew 5:16: In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and Praise your *Father in Heaven*.

⁹ Isaiah 5:20: Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who call *darkness light* and out of darkness *Light* makes darkness, turning sour into sweet and sweet into sour.

¹⁰ Deuteronomy 33:8: And concerning Levi he said: Your lot, "*Light and justice*," shall remain with your righteous in your faithful one, whom you

tempted to Massa, for whom you fought at the waters of Hades.

¹¹ Ijob 41:10: His sneezing makes *light* shine; his eyes are like the eyelashes of the *dawn*.

¹² Proverbs 3:5-7: Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not trust in your own understanding;.

In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. Do not be *wise* in your own eyes, but fear the Lord and turn away from evil.

¹³ Revelation 4:11: O Lord our God, you are worthy to receive glory and *honor* and power, for You created all things, and by your will they have their essence and were created.
(The will precedes the effect).

¹⁴ Colossians 2:3: In **Jesus** are hidden all the treasures of *wisdom* and knowledge.

¹⁵ Psalm 86:11: Teach me your *way* , O Lord, that I may walk in your *truth*; keep my heart in the one thing, that I fear your name.

¹⁶ Ephesians 2:10: For we are his *workmanship*, created in **Christ Jesus** to do good *works*, which God has prepared beforehand that we should walk in it.

¹⁷ John 17:17: Sanctify them in the *truth*; your **word** is truth.

¹⁸ Isaiah 51:4: Listen to me, you nations; hear me, you peoples! For instruction will come from the Lord. I will run out, and I will soon make my right a light to the nations.

Bible passage 16 expresses that humans do not exist by chance, but are created by God. This creation is purposeful, namely for good works that God planned even before creating humankind. Humans are therefore meant to follow these paths and perform these works prescribed by God.

Bible passage 33 clearly expresses that God alone is worthy to receive praise, honor and power, since he is the creator of all things.

Verses 1-9 in Ephesians 2 describe how people were separated from God by their own actions and unbelief. But through God's grace and through faith in Jesus Christ, they are reconciled to God and called to a life characterized by good works, which God has planned for them.

These Bible passages show that the Bible does not view *truth* merely as an abstract idea, but as something that manifests itself in *the ways* and actions *of* people and is connected to God's actions. In *ways*, *effect* is achieved and *information* and *wisdom* are revealed (Psalm 51:15).

Information and effect correspond to *sowing* and *harvesting*.

The biblical passages also make it clear that God and Jesus Christ are the sole source of glory, honor, and power, and should therefore be worshipped and honored without reservation.
